## US SENATE PASSES OCEAN SHIPPING ACT REFORM

On 31 March, the U.S. Senate passed the formal vote on the Ocean Shipping Reform Act of 2022 (OSRA) which was introduced in February by Senators Amy Klobuchar (Democrat-Minnesota) John Thune (Republican-South Dakota), and was approved by the Committee on Commerce, Science and Transportation last week. The Senate is now ready for negotiations with the House of Representatives to find a compromise to be signed by the US President.

# US INITIATIVE TO EASE SUPPLY CHAIN CONGESTION

On 15 March, the Biden administration and U.S. Department of Transportation launched a pilot program to have ocean carriers, ports, and retailers share data

with each other to improve the flow of goods, speed up delivery times and ease supply chain congestion. The initiative is called Freight Logistics Optimization Works (FLOW) and includes eighteen participants, including port authorities, warehousing, and logistics companies.
