

■ NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-s) FOR ASSIGNING AN EORI NUMBER

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES:



1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1)(a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

YES, if they apply on voluntary basis

2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned?

Estimated up to 10 days (for the moment we have no experience on the period of the assigning process)

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

Only the <u>signed</u> application form (which is a print-out of the application data entered on the website). Since Austrian Customs has electronic access to the business register, no additional documents are necessary for legal persons; for natural persons, proof of legal residence may be added to the application form.

NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-s) FOR ASSIGNING AN EORI NUMBER

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

Economic operators who have their registered office or central headquarters in Belgium

These economic operators need to fill in the appropriate application form available on the EORI website and send it to the EORI Cell by email or postal service. The EORI number is structured as follows: BE + the registration number of the Belgian Crossroads Bank for Enterprises (BE + 10 digits).

• Economic operators who have their registered office or central headquarters in a third country and who intend to perform their first customs activities in Belgium OR have a permanent business establishment in Belgium

These economic operators need to fill in the appropriate application form available on the EORI website and send it to the EORI Cell by email or postal service. The EORI number is structured as follows: BE + ISO alpha 2 third country code + 6 digits.

1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1)(a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

Yes. Upon request and on the basis of their Belgian national registration number, persons other than economic operators can apply for an EORI number. The EORI number is structured as follows: BE + 12 digits.

- 2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned?
 - **Belgian economic operators**: 1 or 2 working days after receiving a complete application form.
 - Third country economic operators: up to 5 working days after receiving a complete application form

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

Only for third country economic operators:

- In case of **natural persons**: valid passport or other travel document.
- In case of **legal persons** or **associations of persons**: commercial register document (original or certified copy of an official identification document issued by the authorities responsible for the commercial register or by a Chamber of Commerce in the EU or in the third country).
- In case of **permanent business establishment in Belgium:** official document proving the permanent business establishment in Belgium. This official document expressly states that the applicant complies with the provisions of Article 5 (32) UCC.

■ NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-s) FOR ASSIGNING AN EORI NUMBER

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

Economic operators established in this country

There are two ways economic operators (EO) could apply:

- Either by submitting paper form by hard copy
- Or through online form via on-line web service provided by Bulgarian Customs Administration.

Paper form: paper copy of the application form (Annex of Annex of Ordinance H-9 of 07.11.2018 of the Minister of Finance of the Republic of Bulgaria) with all accompanying documents should be submitted to the competent customs office.

On-line web service: EO could use the on-line web service to obtain an EORI number. To access the EORI web service, EO needs to do the following:

- to have a valid, qualified electronic signature as required by the Regulation (EU) № 910/2014 on electronic identification and trust services for electronic transactions in the internal market (eIDAS Regulation) and repealing Directive 1999/93/EC and the Bulgarian act for Electronic Document and Electronic Signature;
- to have a valid registration in the e-Portal for exchange of information with Bulgarian Customs Agency. The registration could be accomplished in the Registration section of the e-Portal of the Bulgarian Customs Agency;
- to request an EORI2 service account through the "User and access management" service, process "1. Requesting access to the systems (national and EC's central)" for the registered legal or natural person;
- to access the EORI registration workspace via "User Management and Access" section of the e-Portal of the Bulgarian Customs Agency where you can submit the necessary data to obtain the EOPI number via EORI registration portal.

Additional instructions and guides related to the EORI registration and portal are published on the E-portal of the Customs Agency in the section "Current documents".

For further assistance, EO could register his request at Service Desk (where he will receive a registration number immediately), send it to servicedesk@customs.bg where it will be registered by an operator or by contacting us at the following phone number: +359 2 98594980.

• Economic operators not established in the EU

The procedure is the same as for Bulgarian economic operators on the paper. The registration form has to be completed in Bulgarian language.

• If relevant: other persons than listed above

The procedure is the same as above. The identification documents are valid passport or identity document.

1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1)(a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

Yes.

2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned?

Registration process will take up to 3 days after registration form submission.

II. **DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS**

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

The persons established in the EU should provide an official document providing identification data of the EOS and issued by the authorities responsible for the companies register.

The EORI registration form should be accompanied by:

- filled in registration form;
- document from Trade register for legal persons;
- ID card for natural persons

When registration form is lodged by authorized person, the notarized power of attorney has to be presented only for natural person. The authorized person has to be expressly authorized for registration and for declaration of registration data amendments if necessary.

The persons non-established in the EU applying for EORI number should provide:

- filled in registration form in Bulgarian
- A proof of registration issued by a competent authority of the respective country containing the necessary identification and good standing issued not later than 6 month prior to submission of the documents for EORI registration, accompanied by a certified translation into Bulgarian;
 - Valid passport (for natural persons).

In case the registration form is to be submitted by an attorney, the attorney should also submit a notarized Power of Attorney explicitly specifying that he was authorized to perform the registration, accompanied by a certified translation into Bulgarian.

■ NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-S) FOR ASSIGNING AN EORI NUMBER

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

• Economic operators established in this country

All persons (legal, natural, tradesmen, associations) who want to be registered in EORI system need to submit an application for an EORI number on a form available at Croatian customs web site:

https://carina.gov.hr/UserDocsImages//dokumenti/Procedure/Propisi//PRILOG%201%20-%20Zahtjev%20za%20dodjeljivanje%20EORI%20broja.pdf

It may be submitted in person, by post or by e-mail.

All economic operators established in Croatia have a unique personal identification number (OIB) assigned by the Tax Administration. Customs authorities' national EORI database retrieves data from the OIB database. When a person applies for an EORI number, the customs officer receiving the application enters OIB in the national EORI system where a set of data is sent electronically from OIB register to the customs EORI system and the EORI number, whose structure is HR+OIB, is generated and assigned to the person requesting it.

Economic operators not established in the EU

Economic operators not established in the EU may submit the application in Croatian or English. The EORI registration proces for economic operators not established in the EU but having an OIB is the same as for economic operators established in Croatia.

In case of economic operators not established in the EU and not having an OIB, the customs officer receiving the application coppies all dana from the aplication to the national EORI database and a generic EORI numeri s generated ans assigned to the person requesting it.

1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1)(a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

Yes, all persons participating in activities covered by customs legislation are registered in EORI system, including private persons.

2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned?

Registration process usually takes from a few minutes to a few days, depending on the technical conditions and data consistency in the application and OIB register, but no longer than 30 days.

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

Economic operators established in Croatia and economic operators not established in the EU registered in OIB register don't have to provide documents other than the application. Exceptionally, when the application is submitted by a private person by e-mail than a scanned identification card on both sides should be provided.

Economic operators not established in the EU and not registered in OIB register submitting the application for an EORI number need to prove their identity:

- In case of natural persons, by a copy of a valid passport or other travel document,
- In case of legal persons or associations of persons, by original or certified copy of an official document (in English or translated in Croatian) from the business register or from Chambers of Commerce in the third country.
- In case of holders of TIR Carnet, by a copy of TIR Carnet including identification number of the holder.

▼ NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-s) FOR ASSIGNING AN EORI NUMBER

I. **DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:**

Economic operators established in this country

Economic operators have to apply for EORI registration on paper. Applications should be submitted to the Department of Customs and Excise.

forms for EORI registration are available on the CY Customs website: Application http://www.mof.gov.cy/ce

The application should be signed in the presence of the proper Customs Officer, otherwise the signature should be properly certified.

After acceptance of the application the certificate for EORI registration is issued and sent to the applicant by post.

economic operators not established in the EU

The procedure is the same as above.

If relevant: other persons than listed above

The procedure is the same as above.

1. Are EORI numbers be assigned in accordance with Article 6(1)(a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

YES

2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned?

The estimated time for registration of a correctly completed application is 2-24 hours.

II. **DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS**

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

For <u>legal persons</u>, the following certificates and documents need to be provided:

- Certificate of registration of the legal person,
- Certificate of directors,
- Certificate for VAT registration (if the person has a VAT number),
- Authorisation for a Representative or Power of Attorney (if required).

For <u>natural persons</u> the following certificates and documents need to be provided:

- Identification Card or Passport,
- Certificate for VAT registration (if the person has a VAT number),
- Authorisation for a Representative or Power of Attorney (if required).

NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-S) FOR ASSIGNING AN EORI NUMBER

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

Economic operators established in this country

The economic operator has to ask for an EORI number to be assigned, fill in the EORI application and attach the required documents. The EO submits the application with the documents at any customs office.

In particular Czech economic operators can also apply for EORI registration by filling in an application form published on the Czech customs website (see https://forms.celnisprava.cz/webfiller/formservice/filler.open?DocID=198817515).

• Economic operators not established in the EU

The same process is used for other EOs who are not EU operators.

1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1)(a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

NO

2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned?

From a few minutes to a few days. It depends on the technical conditions as well as on the volume of applications handled.

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

Only for economic operator not established in the EU - an official document providing identification data of the EOs and issued by the authorities responsible for the companies register in the third country.

For all operators - certificate for VAT registration as appropriate (if the person has a VAT number in the Czech Republic and/or in another Member state/s).

NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-s) FOR ASSIGNING AN EORI NUMBER

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

A Danish EORI number requires a Danish business identification number (CVR in Danish). Registered businesses are automatically assigned an EORI number if they register the CVR number/company for import or export or both.

The companies CVR number is used as the EORI-identification number by adding the country code prefix DK to it, example DK11223344.

If you are a non-Danish company and not a Danish citizen, the company registration is applied on the website <u>Virk Indberet - create</u> for the registration of a foreign company. The import and export registration is included as an option, for the assignment of an EORI number. Special service registration and complementory information for the EORI number may be required additionally.

Companies already registered in Denmark that need an EORI number can register via their companies own account login on the website <u>Virk Indberet - change</u>.

Without a CVR number, the EORI registration takes a week. With a CVR number, the EORI registration takes a few days.

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

Denmark does not require other documents for the EORI-registration if you are already CVR registered. There are special circumstances with the registration of a foreign company by non-Danish citizens, which may require other additional information.

Documents required for Import and Export registration and new registration in Denmark can be found at Virk Indberet - create and Virk Indberet - change.

Companies that need any changes regarding the EORI number can contact the Danish Customs administration (Toldstyrelsen) via message through their companies login credentials on the administrations website or visit the Customs administrations page about registration.

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

Economic operators established in this country

The economic operator (EO) will not get an EORI number automatically. The EO must apply for an EORI number, because he must allow or refuse publication of his data on the Commission website. The EO can apply for an EORI number only electronically. To submit an application, the EO must obtain access permission to use the e-tax/e-customs system (e-MTA) and permissions for carrying out customs formalities. The e-tax/e-customs system, (e-MTA) working languages are Estonian, English and Russian.

• Economic operators not established in the EU

The economic operator (EO) will not get an EORI number automatically. The EO must apply for an EORI number, because he must allow or refuse publication of his data on the Commission website. The EO can apply for an EORI number electronically in the e-tax/e-customs system (e-MTA) or by submitting an application in paper form to a service bureaus of the Tax and Customs Board . The application form is published on the Estonian Tax and Customs Board website. To submit an electronic application, the EO must obtain access permission to use the e-tax/e-customs system (e-MTA) and permissions for carrying out customs formalities. To submit an application in paper form, the EO must provide additional documents. The e-tax/e-customs system (e-MTA) working languages are Estonian, English and Russian.

1. Are EORI numbers be assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1)(a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

YES, if relevant.

2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned? Registration process will take up to 24 hours, but may vary depending on circumstances.

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

EOs who already have permission to use the e-tax/e-customs system (e-MTA) do not have to present any additional documentation. To obtain permission, EOs must present a business registry document and the ID document of the person who is applying for permission. When entering the e-tax/e-customs system (e-MTA) the EO will be authenticated according to the choice made when obtaining permission to use e-MTA (ID-card, Mobiil-ID, Smart-ID, eIDAS). The EO will apply for an EORI number in the e-tax/e-customs system (e-MTA).

In case the EORI application in paper form is submitted, a notarial power of attorney is also required.

- I. Description of the EORI registration processes for:
 - Economic operators established in this country

The Finnish EORI data consists of economic operators registered for customs purposes (import, export, transit) in the customer register of the Finnish customs.

New Dutch EOs who apply for an EORI number before starting activities covered by Customs legislation, are referred to a specific office of Dutch Customs. This office is called the National Customs Help Desk.

The combination of the characters 'NL' and the fiscal number of the EO, is used to provide the EORI number. If the fiscal number has less than 9 numbers, it will automatically start with one or two zeros so that the EORI number will always be 'NL' + 9 numbers.

Economic operators not established in the EU

EOs from third countries who apply in the Netherlands for an EORI number before starting activities covered by customs legislation are referred to a specific office of Dutch customs. This office is called the National Customs Help Desk.

If relevant: other persons than listed above

New Dutch EOs who didn't apply for an EORI number, will automatically be assigned an EORI number after the first time they are mentioned in a customs declaration that is lodged in the Dutch declaration system.

The time for a manually assigned EORI number for a Dutch EO will take 1 working day.

The time for a manually assigned EORI number for an EO established outside the EU will take maximum 5 working days.

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

economic operators established in this country

The EORI number is assigned only to those EOs that apply for the registration. No so-called *ad hoc* numbers are assigned, e.g. without submission of the completed and signed application form for registration/update containing all the necessary data.

The registration process is conducted in the Integrated Commodity Trading Entrepreneurs' Registration System (SZPROT). Applications are submitted via the Electronic Services Portal of the Customs and Fiscal Service (PUESC) at the address: www.puesc.gov.pl and serviced in electronic form. Applications for updating the entity data or deactivation of the EORI number are serviced in the same way.

The registration procedure starts with **creating the account on the PUESC.** The account is always set up by a natural person authorised to act on behalf of the economic operator before the customs authorities. It may be, in particular, an owner of the enterprise, a person authorised in accordance with registration documents of the company, a proxy or a representative for customs affairs.

Following the opening of the account, the authorised person fills in and sends the *Application for registration of the natural person data in SISC* in electronic form. If the application is filled in correctly - the person receives the ID SISC number (the unique identification number attributed to persons during the registration process in the Customs and Fiscal Service Information System (SISC).

The next step is the **registration of the economic entity,** through filling in and sending the *Application for registration of the economic operator in SICS*, published on PUESC. While filling in the application, "Customs" option should be checked in the "Area of operations in SC" field, and the "assign the EORI number" should be checked – the application filled in according to this procedure in the customs area is simultaneously the application for attributing the EORI number. As a result of registration, the ID SISC number, which is simultaneously the EORI number, will be attributed to the Economic Entity.

The last step is **linking of the natural person data with the data of the entity** on behalf of which the natural person intends to act (representative). In order to register the authorisation to act on behalf of the economic entity, the electronic *Application for registration/updating/deactivation of the representation in SISC*, also published on PUESC, should be filled in and sent.

On PUESC, detailed information is available concerning the registration process "step by step".

If it turns out during the registration process that the data submitted are incorrect or have been earlier registered in the system, the EORI number will not be assigned. The economic operator is bound to provide correct data and update them in case if they change.

Poland does not assign ad hoc numbers. All numbers are assigned on a permanent basis.

• economic operators not established in the EU

Poland does not assign ad hoc numbers. All numbers are assigned on a permanent basis.

A foreign economic operator should attach the original - in case of submission of the application in a hard copy, or a copy/scanned copy - in case of submission of the application in electronic form (or a printout from the foreign computerised registration system) - of the extract from the register of economic activity from the country where the economic operator is established (or other document of the same nature), confirming the authorisation to establish a representative by persons who issued the power of attorney.

If the submitted documents do not contain information confirming the authorisation to represent on behalf of a person (persons) signing the *Application for registration of the economic operator in SICS*, the applicant is obliged to supplement it and duly document the rights of representation it holds. Moreover, the translation of documents drawn up in a foreign language should be attached ("working" translations are permissible, however, in case of doubts concerning their contents, on request of the customs authority the official translation should be submitted).

If an economic operator fails to attach the required document referred to above, the assigned EORI number is of temporary nature. The missing document should be sent to the Chamber of Fiscal Administration in Poznań or submitted to the nearest customs office, by attaching it to the correctly completed *Application for update of the Economic Operator's data in SISC*.

If the updating application containing the correct data and the required attachments is not submitted within 30 days following the day of assigning the number, the EORI number will be deactivated.

• if relevant: other persons than listed above

Not relevant.

The procedure in case of lack of access to PUESC

In case if, at the moment of performing the first activity implemented in the customs area, a person has no access to the PUESC and goods are waiting for customs clearance at the border or the PUESC is not available, he/she may apply to the nearest customs office (to the specially designated e-Customer Contact Point) or send the hard copy of the application to the address of the Chamber of Fiscal Administration in Poznań.

Information on assigning the EORI number will be sent electronically to the e-mail address provided by the applicant and, in urgent matters, to the customs office where the application was submitted.

■ NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-s) FOR ASSIGNING AN EORI NUMBER

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

Economic operators established in this country

The EORI number for **economic operators established in Portugal** is 'PT' plus the tax identification number (NIF) already assigned by tax authorities. So the registration process will be fully automatic.

As we use an existing number for the EORI number, it is not necessary for traders already known by PT customs administration to apply for an EORI number. They will be automatically assigned and issued with an EORI number. Nonetheless, PT economic operators will be invited to add optional data, such as consent to publication, using a dedicated page on the official website for electronic declarations (using the electronic signature).

For new economic operators established in PT, we register and assign them an EORI number immediately, as they enter the tax number in the customs declaration field or in another customs document required for other customs operations that requires an EORI number, once it is confirmed that they meet the legal requirements for economic operators (i.e. being a natural person or a legal person with tax status), through an interface with the tax database opened automatically by the various declaration systems. So, if they do not yet have a tax number (NIF), they must obtain it in advance from the PT authorities responsible for assigning the NIF. All the new information entered in the PT EORI database will be exported to the central database of the EC at the next opportunity on the same day.

In spite of that, we noted that new economic operators established in PT, that don't have yet an EORI number assign by PT, can always be automatically register on AT web site (www.portaldasfinancas.gov.pt) in the menu Declarações Electrónicas", submenu "Alteração/complemento de registo de operadores estabelecidos em PT". For that propose they shall indicate their NIF, and the EORI number will be assigned at the moment. However, the EORI Number will be on the central system only in the next day. This procedure is particularly important for PT EO that made the first declaration in a member state different from PT.

• Economic operators not established in the EU

Economic operators not established in the customs territory of the Union can apply for registration using a form that can be downloaded and filled in manually and submitted by post to the authority responsible for assigning an EORI number. In this case, it will be necessary to present legal documents proving identity and legal status, to confirm identity, before being assigned an EORI number.

For economic operators not established in the customs territory of the Union, the EORI number will be 'PT' plus the ISO country code of the corresponding operator followed by a sequential seven-digit number, the last being a check digit. This registration process will take at least 24 hours once the supporting documents have been supplied.

1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6(1)(a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

YES. For all portuguese natural persons, the EORI is assigned since they establish an interaction with AT customs systems.

1. Registration process: how long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned?

This question is partially answered above. There is no waiting period for an EORI number if the economic operator is already registered with the tax administration. The EORI registry is created by automatic extraction of the necessary data from the tax systems. The EORI registration is exported to the central system in the same day. Under Portuguese law, if the EO is not registered with the tax administration or has no business registration, he is not an authorised economic operator for customs purposes.

For non- EU economic operators, the time taken may vary and will depend on the number of days taken to receive the application together supporting documents submitted by post and the work needed to check their validity and legality. This may be between six and ten working days.

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

PT EOs don't have to provide any document because the EORI is assigned immediately as they enter their tax identification number, once it is confirmed that they meet the legal requirements.

EOs established outside the EU have to provide the agreement form, the consent to publication in EOS and the documents proving to be a legal entity.

Economic operators established in this country

In order to be assigned an EORI number, economic operators must fill in an application form using the EORI-RO application on the website of the National Customs Authority: www.custosm.ro, section 'e-customs', subsection EORI, *Computerised system*.

The application is recorded in EORI-RO, then printed and lodged, after being signed and stamped by the applicant, at the Customs Regional Directorate for the applicant's place of residence.

Economic operators who have their head office in Romania should submit the application with copies of the following documents:

- a) registration certificate issued by the National Trade Register Office;
- b) VAT registration certificate issued by the competent fiscal body, as appropriate
- c)documents stating the present head office or fiscal domicile, as appropriate, if the latter does not correspond to that stated on the certificate presented.
- d) constitutive act of the economic operator, as subsequently amended and supplemented, as appropriate

After cross -checking the data in the application against the supporting documents, the Customs Regional Directorate assigns the EORI number and notifies applicant via EORI-RO the assignment of the EORI number at the e-mail address given in the application.

The EORI number has the following structure: ROX.....X, where X......X is an alphanumeric series of up to 15 characters consisting of the single identification code or the fiscal registration code.

• Economic operators not established in the EU

In order to be assigned an EORI number, economic operators must fill in an application form using the EORI-RO application on the website of the National Customs Authority: http://www.customs.ro/ section 'e-customs', subsection EORI, *Computerised system*.

The application is recorded in EORI-RO, then printed and lodged, after being signed by the applicant:

- a) at the Customs Regional Directorate for the location where activities are to be conducted, as provided for in Article 9(2) of The Union Customs Code (Regulation (EU) No 952/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council, or
 - b) at the border customs office, for TIR carnet holders.
 - If relevant: other persons than listed above

EORI numbers are also assigned to persons, other than economic operators, who are established in Romania, subject to the provisions of art. 9 par. (3) lit. a) of the Code, as well as art. 6 par. (1) of the Delegated Regulation (EU) 2015/2446;

The procedure is the same as for economic operators.

1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1) (a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

YES

2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned?

Approximately 2 days.

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

- The application for an EORI number is accompanied by the following documents:
- a) a copy of the registration document issued by the competent authority in the third country;
- b) a copy of the registration certificate for VAT purposes issued by the competent authority in the third country,

c) documents stating the present head office or fiscal domicile, as appropriate, if the latter does not correspond to that stated on the registration document referred to in (a) issued by the competent authorities in the third country, the original or a legalised copy issued no more than six months previously.

d) a photocopy of the valid passport or other travel document for individuals.

• For TIR carnet holders, the application for an EORI number is lodged at the border customs office and is accompanied by the following documents

- a) a copy of the cover of the TIR carnet, with the stamp containing the identification data of the TIR carnet holder;
 - b) a copy of the passport of the vehicle driver.

After cross -checking the data in the application against the supporting documents, the Regional Directorate for Excise and Customs Operations/border customs office assigns the EORI number and notifies the applicant via EORI-RO of the assignment of the EORI number at the e-mail address given in the application.

The EORI number has the following structure: ROX.....X, where X......X is an alphanumeric series of up to 15 characters consisting of the ISO alfa 2 country code of the country of residence of the person obtaining the EORI number, followed by the identification code or the registration code for VAT purposes.

For TIR carnet holders, the structure of the EORI number is: ROTZZZX X, where:

- a) the letter 'T' represents the identifier for economic operators authorised for the TIR regime, under the Customs Convention of the International Transport of Goods under Cover of TIR Carnets;
- b) 'ZZZ' represents the three-figure code of the national guaranteeing association through which the TIR carnet holder was authorised for the TIR regime;
 - c) 'X..X' represents the number of the TIR carnet holder assigned by the national guaranteeing association (10 characters maximum).

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

• Economic operators established in Slovenia:

There is no need for Slovenian economic operators and natural persons to apply for an EORI number. For these persons the registration process is automatic.

• Economic operators not established in the EU:

These economic operators should make an application for EORI registration. The application for the assignment of an EORI number and the required documents are to be sent to the authority responsible for registration of economic operator and assigning an EORI number. The information on the assigned EORI number will be sent to the economic operator not established in the EU by e-mail or by fax entered into his/her application.

1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1) (a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

Yes, for Slovenian natural persons.

Economic operators established in Slovenia:

letter of authorization for representation – mandatory only when the application is not signed by the responsible person of a legal person but by the person authorized by this person;

original official document(s) providing identification data (name, address and date of establishment, type of person) and issued at the latest three months earlier by the authorities responsible for the business register or by chambers of commerce in the third country, or

in case of authorized TIR carnet holder a copy of the TIR carnet with legible id. No. of the authorized TIR carnet holder;

official translation of those documents into English – if required by the authority responsible for registering and assigning an EORI number.

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

• Economic operators established in this country

Every operator registered in Spain has a tax identification number (they are already registered for custom and tax purposes), so we will register them ex-officio, except branches or foreign persons (legal or natural).

They may communicate their written consent to the publication of personal data and other information through our website (virtual Customs and Excise Office).

Those operators who need to apply for an EORI number may do so through our website (virtual Customs and Excise Office).

• Economic operators not established in the EU

These operators do not have a tax identification number, so are not registered for customs or tax purposes. They cannot use the website to apply, because an electronic signature linked to the tax identification number is needed. So, they can apply in any customs office, providing the information/documentation needed (see point 3).

• If relevant: other persons than listed above

Only natural persons established in Spain will be given an EORI number (apart, of course, from those conducting customs activities). (The procedure is described in the previous paragraph).

If the trader has previously been assigned a tax identification number, EORI registration will take less than a week (5 working days). If not, the timeframe will depend on the time needed to get a tax identification number (about 10 working days).

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

Operators who have not previously been assigned a tax identification number should ask for one to the responsible authority in the Tax Agency. They will need to provide this authority with an original passport (in the case of natural persons) or a document from the business register. This document must be translated into Spanish with an apostille. Once they have been given it, they will be registered in EORI.

NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-s) FOR ASSIGNING AN EORI NUMBER

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

• Economic operators established in this country

Economic operators who need an EORI number have to apply for it. They will receive their EORI number when we have registered them in our Client Management System and the data has been received in the central EORI database (EOS). Most applications from economic operators established in Sweden can be managed automatically and they receive their EORI number in about ten minutes.

Some applications have to be handled manually. If we have got all information that we need the applicant can receive an EORI number in about 24 hours.

To submit the application, the applicant or the representative must verify their identity with an e-ID.

• Economic operators not established in the EU

Economic operators not established in the EU can apply for an EORI number. Legal persons from countries outside the EU have to present a document from a business register. The document may not be older than six months. We carry out an investigation and check, among other things, that they have not been assigned an EORI number in another Member State. The applicant also needs to prove that Sweden is the first EU country were to conduct customs operations. If we accept their application, we register them in our Client Management System and after that we send them their EORI number.

Our aim is to process an application and register the operator within 5 working days.

• Economic operator with a Swedish branch

If companies established outside the EU have a Swedish branch (corporation company number beginning with 5164), it is the main company that must apply for EORI number and we can connect the Swedish branch to the EORI number of the main company. This link means that the company is considered established in the EU. We cannot link branches located in other Member States.

• Other persons than listed above

Sometimes natural persons have to apply for an EORI number. For example, if they apply for certain types of authorisations from the Customs administration.

The same web forms as above can be used.

Private persons resident in Sweden have to enter their personal identity number.

Natural persons resident outside the European Union have to present a copy with information from their passport. Our aim is to handle the application and register the EORI number within 5 days.

1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1) (a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

YES, to natural persons who apply for authorisation.

2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned? See above.

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an EORI number?

Legal persons from countries outside the EU have to present a document from a business register.

The document may not be older than six months. Natural person from countries outside the EU have to present a copy with information from their passport.

Applicants established in countries outside the EU are asked to show that Sweden is the first country for their customs operations in the EU.

NATIONAL PROCEDURE (-S) FOR ASSIGNING AN XI EORI NUMBER

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE EORI REGISTRATION PROCESSES FOR:

• Economic operators established in Northern Ireland

All new economic operators will have to submit an electronic application by visiting www.gov.uk/eori. and following the link to apply for an EORI that starts with XI.

Before accessing the electronic application, applicants must have applied for, or already have, an EORI that starts with GB. They are also required to check they're eligible for an EORI that starts with XI.

• Economic operators not established in the EU

If your business is not established (has no premises) in Northern Ireland or the EU:

You need to register with the customs authorities of the place where you intend to make your first declaration or apply for a decision.

You do not need an EORI number that starts with XI if any of the following apply:

- you already have an EU EORI number;
- you only move goods on the island of Ireland or between Northern Ireland and an EU country;

- your <u>business</u> is 'established' (has <u>premises</u>) in an EU country but not in Northern Ireland in this case, you must register in the EU country.
- 1. Are EORI numbers assigned in accordance with Article 6 (1)(a) UCC-DA to persons other than economic operators?

2. How long it takes to assign an EORI number from receipt of a request from the trader concerned?

Applicants will receive an EORI number starting with XI within 5 working days.

II. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

3. Which documents should be presented by an economic operator during the registration process for assigning an XI EORI number?

Once you have an EORI that starts with GB you can then go on to apply for an EORI that starts with XI. Applicants will need:

- an XI VAT number (if they have one)
- any VAT numbers issued by an EU country
- 2 documents showing proof of their permanent business establishment in Northern Ireland for example, a bank statement and a utility bill.

You will not be asked for proof of a permanent business establishment in Northern Ireland if:

- The establishment address on your GB EORI application is in Northern Ireland
- Your business is not based (established) in Northern Ireland but you need an EORI number to make certain declarations or act as a carrier, for example.as set out on <u>Gov.uk</u>.

1. Introduction

1.1. DOCUMENT PURPOSE

This document (GLP) defines the Go-Live procedure that economic operators have to apply prior to launch of the Release 3 of ICS2 system.

The main purpose of this GLP is to set up all practical arrangements in preparation of the official launch of ICS2 Release 3.

1.2. TARGET AUDIENCE

The GLP is intended to be used by EOs involved in the planning, organisation, and co-ordination of golive of ICS2 system for Release 3.

1.3. SCOPE

This GLP covers all the necessary organisational steps related to ICS2 Release 3 Go-Live procedure, which need to be taken by the Economic Operators to prepare for the launch of the system. This document is owned and controlled by DG TAXUD.

Technical steps to be taken by DG TAXUD contractors related to ICS2 Release 3 Go-live procedure are not in the scope of this document.

1.4. STRUCTURE OF THIS DOCUMENT

2. APPLICABLE LEGAL PROVISIONS WITH THE DEPLOYMENT OF ICS2 RELEASE 3

With the go-live of ICS2 Release 3 all the provisions of the UCC [R05], UCC IA [R01] and UCC DA [R02] become applicable. Within this scope they are applicable for all Member States and economic operators as from 3 June 2024, except where a deployment window in accordance with the UCC Work Programme [R03] and ICS2 Transition from R2 to R3 strategy [R04] was granted to an economic operator. In the latter case the provisions become applicable for the economic operator when the granted deployment window ends.

3. PROCEDURE TO GO-LIVE WITH ICS2 RELEASE 3

3.1. Pre-conditions to go-live with ICS2 Release 3

EOs:

- EO system compatible with the ICS2 Release 3 specifications (EO has successfully completed self-conformance testing), or
- use of the ITSP system compatible with the ICS2 Release 3 specifications (ITSP has successfully completed self-conformance testing), or
- use of the STI STP (interface developed by DG TAXUD) to lodge the ENS filings and/or arrival notifications;
- confirmation of the MS of registration about successful self-conformance for the roles and messages that the EO will be using to submit their ENSs and other notifications, where EO or ITSP system is used.

3.3. PREPARATIONS TO BE CARRIED OUT BY EOS

The following activities should be taken by EOs in preparation to their go-live:

EOs should follow instructions provided by MS of registration. In case the EO is established in Norway or Switzerland, they should follow instructions provided by the country of their establishment.

4. TRANSITION FROM ICS2 RELEASE 2 TO RELEASE 3

This section describes the transition from ICS2 Release 2 to Release 3 by the MSs and EOs. The transition is impacted by the deployment windows granted to the economic operators in line with the UCC Work Programme [R03].

4.1. TRANSITION OF THE MEMBER STATES

All MSs being already in ICS2 Release 2 are ready for operations of ICS2 Release 3 on 3 June 2024.

Processing of the ENSs:

- all ENSs lodged into ICS must be finalised in ICS by lodging the arrival (only for maritime) and presentation notifications, if applicable, to that system. As soon as EO has started filing into ICS2, they can no longer continue filing new ENSs into ICS;
- until all EOs connect to ICS2, the MS will have to support the processing of ICS and ICS2 of the ENSs. The cut-off date for processing of the ICS for(3):
 - o maritime carriers is 4 December 2024;
 - o maritime house filers is 1 April 2025;
 - o road carriers is 1 September 2025;
 - o rail carriers is 1 September 2025.

Processing of the arrival notifications:

- arrival notifications for ENSs lodged into ICS, must be lodged into the same system;
- arrival notification lodged to ICS2 must be lodged either via STI (STP) or national arrival system if such system exists and is compatible with ICS2 requirements;
- EOs can choose any interface to lodge their arrival notifications that is available to them.

Processing of the presentation:

• presentation notification will be submitted into the Member State system for AN/PN/TS (arrival notification/ presentation notification/ temporary storage) declarations for all ENSs irrespective if they were lodged into ICS or ICS2. Presentation information that must be submitted from NES to ICS2 CR can be obtained from the new MS AN/PN/TS system.

4.2. PROCEDURE TO GRANT THE DEPLOYMENT WINDOW FOR EOS

Deployment window can be granted to the EOs with different role in overall ICS2 business process (maritime carrier, maritime house filer, road carrier, rail carrier) within the following timeframe:

- maritime carriers from 3 June 2024 till 4 December 2024;
- EO lodging ENS house level filings for maritime consignments from 4 December 2024 till 1 April 2025;
- rail and road carriers from 1 April 2025 till 1 September 2025.

In case the EOs operate several modes of transport, e.g., maritime house filer and road carrier, they may choose one go-live date for all their ENS filings. However, this date should not be later than the earliest end date of the deployment windows for their modes of transport. For example, if EO operates as maritime house filer and road carrier, their go-live date should be at the latest at the end of the maritime house filer deployment window.

⁽³⁾ As of indicated date ICS should not accept new ENSs lodged by economic operators with different roles. Processing of already lodged ENSs in ICS should be finalised in ICS.

The MS of registration must provide national procedure/guidance to the EOs registered or established (in case of Switzerland and Norway) in that country on the granting of the deployment window. This procedure/guidance should contain at least the following information:

- how should the EO submit formal request to the customs authority to be granted with the deployment window;
- what communication means can be used by the EO to submit the application via e-mail or electronic system of customs authority, via official letter etc.;
- if application in free text format or template should be used to apply for the deployment window;
- what language(s) can be used in the application (please consider that ENS filers located in the 3rd countries will request deployment window);
- how MS of registration will ensure that the EO and/or the ITSP comply with the pre-conditions (see section 3.1) to go-live with ICS2 Release 3;
- any other useful information.

The MS must grant the deployment window to the EOs if they request it. In case the MS does not grant a deployment window for the EO, this will mean that this EO will have to start filing ENSs in ICS2 at the first day of the deployment window for particular EO role in overall ICS2 business process (maritime carrier, maritime house filer, road carrier, rail carrier).

4.3. REQUEST FOR DEPLOYMENT WINDOW

EO that has a legal obligation to file an ENS and is not ready to go-live with ICS2 Release 3 can request a deployment window from the customs authority of the country of registration/establishment. At least the following information should be provided in the application by the EO:

- company name and EORI number;
- role in ICS2 business process (maritime carrier, maritime house filer, road carrier, rail carrier);
- requested duration of the deployment window "from date" and "to date";
- provisional date when EO is planning to go-live with ICS2 Release 3.

MS of registration/establishment should check whether duration of requested deployment window and provisional go-live date is in line with UCC Work Programme [R03] and chapter 5 of GLP.

4.4. EO NOTIFICATION ON PLANNED GO-LIVE DATE

EO willing to go-live with ICS2 Release 3:

- before the end of the granted deployment window;
- before the first day of the deployment window for the particular EO role in overall ICS2 business process (maritime carrier, maritime house filer, road carrier, rail carrier);

should inform MS of registration (and Norway or Switzerland in case EO is established in these countries) at least two weeks before planned go-live date of that. MS of registration (and Norway or Switzerland, if applicable) should verify and ensure, that the planned go-live date is in line with UCC Work Programme [R03] and chapter 5 of GLP.

5. LODGEMENT OF ENS FILINGS AND ARRIVAL NOTIFICATIONS

5.1. MARITIME CARRIERS

To ensure orderly transition from ICS2 Release 2 to Release 3, maritime carriers are the first ones to lodge ICS2 Release 3 ENS filings and arrival notifications.

Some MSs have developed National arrival systems allowing carriers to lodge arrival notifications. Maritime carriers are free to choose which component (central or national) to use to lodge arrival notification.

Please note that newly (after 3 June 2024) registered maritime carriers being ready to lodge ENS filings in ICS2 Release 3 should not be granted with deployment window and they should start lodgement of ENSs. Nevertheless, if deployment window is granted to newly registered maritime carrier it should comply with requirement to lodge ENSs in ICS.

5.2. MARITIME HOUSE FILERS

Maritime house filers should start lodging ICS2 Release 3 ENS filings not earlier than 4 December 2024 or at the end of deployment window granted to the maritime carriers (see section 5.1).

MS should grant maritime house filers with the deployment window until 1 April 2025 if they are not ready to go-live on 4 December 2024.

Please note that newly (after 4 December 2024) registered maritime house filers being ready to lodge ENS filings in ICS2 Release 3 should not be granted with the deployment window and should start lodgement of ENSs.

5.3. ROAD CARRIERS

To ensure orderly transition from ICS2 Release 2 to Release 3, road carriers are expected to lodge ICS2 Release 3 ENS filings as of 1 April 2025.

EOs, acting as road carriers, that are willing to go-live with ICS2 Release 3 before 1 April 2025 should be allowed to do so if they also operate in other modes of transport, e.g., act as maritime house filers. In case MS agrees that road carrier go-live before the legally defined date, MS should inform DG TAXUD and other MS on this at least two weeks in advance.

5.4. RAIL CARRIER

To ensure orderly transition from ICS2 Release 2 to Release 3, rail carriers are expected to lodge ICS2 Release 3 ENS filings as of 1 April 2025.

EOs, acting as rail carriers, that are willing to go-live with ICS2 Release 3 before 1 April 2025 should be allowed to do so if they also operate in other modes of transport, e.g., act as maritime house filers. In case MS agrees that rail carrier go-live before the legally defined date, MS should inform DG TAXUD and other MS on this at least two weeks in advance.
